Special Election – Tuesday – November 5, 2019

Exercise your right to vote. Due to the passage of the November 2018 statewide ballot proposal 18-3, all eligible and registered voters in Michigan may now request an absent voter ballot without providing a reason. Cast your vote from the convenience of your own home. Contact the Clerk's office to obtain an absentee voter application and ballot.

Polls will be open on Election day for in person voting from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM.

REMINDER: The Clerk's office will be open on Saturday, November 2, 2019, from 7:00 am to 3:00 PM for issuing absent voter ballots.

REAL ID-COMPLIANT DRIVER'S LICENSE AND ID INFORMATION



Beginning October 1, 2020, Michigan residents will need to present a REAL ID-compliant document to fly within the United States and enter certain federal facilities under federal law.

If you have an enhanced driver's license or enhanced state ID card, you already have a REAL ID-compliant card. If you don't have an enhanced card, please continue reading.

Take your Michigan license or ID card and proof of your Social Security number and citizenship or legal presence to a Secretary of State office. If your name is different from what's on your birth certificate, you'll need to bring in a certified name-change document, such as your marriage license or court order. Other compliant documents include valid U.S. passports and trusted traveler cards issued by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. Find a full list from the Federal Transportation Security Administration.

Your new cards are marked with a gold circle with a star inside. Enhanced licenses and state IDS that do not have a star on them will be printed with a star when renewed or replaced.

First Michigan License or ID: If you are applying for your first (original) Michigan driver's license or state ID card, visit a Secretary of State office and present documents verifying your Social Security number, identity, U.S. citizenship or legal presence and Michigan residency. If your name is different from what's on your birth certificate, you'll need to bring in a certified name-change document, such as your marriage license or court order. Multiple documents may be needed if your name has changed more than once.
